Grease Trap Maintenance

Grease traps keep (F.O.G.) fats, oils, grease, and other hazardous waste from draining. Your grease trap system traps these oils so they can solidify, and the trap must be emptied and cleaned regularly. The EPA requires that you clean that traps regularly (at least every 90 days minimum.)

The Cleaning Process:

Champion Plumbing grease trap cleaning process and equipment ensures that your operation is minimally disrupted as we clean your grease traps.

- ▶ Grease is quickly and quietly removed using a vacuum unit.
- ▶ During this process, the technicians will pressure wash and remove any build up on the walls of the tank.
- ▶ Clean up any mess made during the cleaning process.
- ▶ Waste is removed, and hauled away to a disposal facility.
- ▶ If any issues or concerns are found, they will be noted and inform the customer immediately.



Septic Tank Services

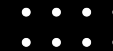
We recommend pumping your septic tank at least every 2-3 years, to maintain proper system function and prevent issues like drain-field problems and backups.

Factors Influencing Frequency:

- ▶ **Tank Size:** Larger tanks may need less frequent pumping.
- ▶ **Household Size:** More people in the house means more waste, requiring more frequent pumping.
- ▶ **Water Usage Habits:** High water usage can lead to quicker sludge buildup.
- ▶ **Sludge and Scum Levels:** The amount of solids (sludge) and grease (scum) in the tank dictates the need for pumping.

Signs of a Full Tank:

- ▶ **Slow Draining:** If toilets or sinks drain slowly, it could be a sign of a full tank.
- ▶ **Gurgling Sounds:** Toilets or showers starts gurgling it can indicate a septic problem.
- ▶ **Backups:** Toilet or drain backups are a clear sign of a full or failing system.
- ▶ **Standing Water:** Water pooling near the septic tank or drain field is a serious sign of a problem.
- ▶ **Sewage Odor:** A strong sewage smell around the house or yard is another sign.



Lift Station Maintenance

Lift stations, also known as pump stations, are vital components of wastewater collection systems that mechanically pump wastewater uphill to a higher elevation. Lift stations are essential when gravity-flow sewers are not feasible due to the topography of the land, or when the sewer line is too deep to be practical.
